Sample Itinerary -

Day 1 - Arrive in the British Virgin Islands and board the yacht at whatever location is most convenient for you. If you are flying in to St Thomas and arriving in the BVI by private water taxi, we like to start at Norman Island so you can hop aboard and begin your vacation right away! If you are flying in to Beef Island airport (EIS) in the BVI, we can meet you right at the airport and escort you directly to the yacht. If you are staying a night or two at a local resort, we will meet you there. We make it very easy to jump aboard and start having fun. Once you're on the boat, we will sail away to a fun anchorage for your first night. The specific spot will depend upon where you board.



Day 2 - Explore the Caves on Norman Island in the morning, and enjoy a great sail to Cooper Island for more exceptional snorkeling. If you are diving, the famous RMS Rhone is an absolute must, conditions permitting. Snorkelers can also get a birds' eye view of the stern section of the shipwreck, and it's definitely worth the splash. Kayaking to Salt Island is also a great activity.





Day 3 - Set sail for the picture-perfect Baths on Virgin Gorda and explore one of the most amazing beaches in the world. Once you visit the Baths, you'll begin noticing that it's used as a location for many photo shoots. Take an afternoon sail to Trellis Bay or Marina Cay for another beautiful anchorage. At Marina Cay, snap a pic in the red phone booth and have a Painkiller at Pusser's bar.



Day 4 - Kayak and/or snorkel at the Dogs and enjoy lunch at the perfect little day anchorage. Next, head over to the North Sound of Virgin Gorda. Visit Leverick Bay Resort where our friends host a Jumbies beach party or you can attend Michael Beans's famous "Happy Arrr" show.



Day 5 - If you are feeling adventurous, head out for a day sail to Anegada, to explore one of the world's largest barrier reefs and take in your own "Corona Beach" at Cow Wreck Bay. This is one of the most beautiful beaches you'll ever see! If you'd rather stay local, you can continue to explore North Sound, Saba Rock, and the many bars, eateries, and boutiques in the area. Yet another option is heading to Monkey Point, another stunning anchorage with great snorkeling and kayaking opportunities.



Day 6 - Set sail for Jost Van Dyke and explore Sandy Spit and/or take a walk to the Bubbly Pool. When the surf is right the Bubbly Pool is like nature's Jacuzzi.



Day 7 - No trip would be complete without a trip to the Soggy Dollar Bar or one of the many other beach bars at White bay on Jost Van Dyke. When leaving White Bay, don't forget to listen to Kenny Chesney's "Adios to Jost!" Spend your last evening at Diamond Cay in Great Harbor.



Day 8 - Last morning aboard! If you're early risers, stop by Soper's Hole to see the beautiful gingerbread architecture on the waterfront. Then it's just a short ride back to meet your private water taxi or hop on the ferry, and where you can start planning your next trip to visit us again!
